Year 6 - World War II

Dear Parents, Carers and Pupils,

Welcome to Year 6! We hope you have recharged your batteries and are now ready for all of the exciting activities planned for the year ahead. We have many things planned for what will be a very busy term. Between now and Christmas, the children's work will mainly be focused on World War II. We have included an overview of educational visits planned for Year 6 but will send you further details closer to the time. We are also working with Nunthorpe Academy to develop the children's skills in English.

English

In English will be using events during WWII as stimulus for non-fiction, report and journalistic writing. As part of our research, we will be developing the style of narrative writing through the story 'Carrie's War' and studying WW1 to inspire the children to write poetry whilst also remembering Remembrance Day.

Mathematics

This term, the children will explore units linked to place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division (including decimals), circles and angles, measures, fractions, order of operations (BIDMAS), 2D and 3D shape, pie charts, averages and algebra (simple formulae). Reasoning and problem solving lessons will continue to be planned into the curriculum.

Science

We will start the term by studying different aspects of the human body. This includes the circulatory system and how nutrients are carried through the body as well as links to PSE regarding healthy eating. In the second half term, the children will be learning about classification of plants and animals.

Physical Education

This term the children will be working with Mr Robinson, Miss Lillystone, Mr Race and Mr Mitchell (our PE specialists).

Computing

The children will continue to use their iPads to support and extend their learning within the classroom. We will look at how internet search results are ranked and understand how to improve and refine searches through using key words. The children will also learn how to use the internet (including search engines) in a safe and responsible way.

Geography

As well as exploring the impact of World War II on our local area, we will use world maps to locate countries involved in World War II. We will identify major towns and cities, key industrial areas and the possible reasons why specific places were targeted by enemy planes and bombs. We will also look at the use of symbols on Ordnance Survey maps and learn to read 6 figure grid references.

History

We will explore the impact WWII had on the lives of the people of Middlesbrough, paying particular attention to how it affected the children.

Art/Design and Technology

After exploring materials and fixing methods, this term's DT challenge is to design and make an air raid shelter that stands the tests of war. Which shelter will be the last one standing?

Music

The children will learn about the appreciation of music during World War II. They will find out about significant musical figures, such as Vera Lynn, and be encouraged to share their opinions and preferences for music during the 1940s. The children will also enjoy a music enrichment day delivered by a specialist teacher.

P.S.H.E.

This term we will explore important rules and apply for our school jobs. We will be looking at 'New Beginnings' as a theme.

Religious Education

The children will learn about Buddhism. This includes why Buddha is important and how the beliefs of Buddhists affect their way of life. Following on from this, we will be exploring Christmas and its significance to Christian people.
