## Year 6 - Moving on

Dear Parents, Carers and Pupils,

We hope you have had an enjoyable Easter and are looking forward to beginning your last term at Normanby! In Year 6 this term, the children will be busy preparing for their Y6 SATs assessments, taking part in the Lake District Residential, working towards an end of year assembly and readying themselves for Secondary School!

### ENGLISH

Our focus this term will be to review the different genres of writing, both Narrative and Non-narrative. Children will be consolidating their skills in text organisation, sentence structure and punctuation and looking at the composition of their writing. We will be continuing our work looking at grammar, punctuation and spelling in preparation for SATs and undertaking a range of reading comprehension activities.

### MATHEMATICS

We will continue to use arithmetic sessions to develop the children's speed and accuracy in written methods. As SATs approach, revision sessions will be used to address key themes and provide the children with an opportunity to explore example questions. Post SATs, there will be a greater focus on Maths investigations and problem solving.

### SCIENCE

We will further investigate the theme of Electricity through our construction of fairground rides.

### COMPUTING

This term we will continue with a range of activities to make use of iPads, such as the recording of science investigations and supporting research of a variety of topics. We will be looking at using spreadsheets to organise, sort, filter information and produce graphs. Also, children will be using ChromeBooks to create their own computer game using a coding programme.

The children are always encouraged to use their iPads independently to locate information about key topics and support their learning through their educational APPs.

### HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

The children will be continuing to learn about the British Monarchy, researching different monarchs in British History and looking at the changing power of monarchs with particular focus on Queen Victoria.

### ART/DT

In Art, we will be exploring the work of some Victorian artists, including William Morris to inspire us to design our own wallpapers. In DT, we will use the Victorian era again and the introduction of the steam powered fairground rides to help us design our own motorised carousels.

### MUSIC/DRAMA

Following SATs, we will be enjoying another music enrichment day with Mr Nixon..

### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The children will continue to undertake P.E. activities with our specialist sports coaches on Friday afternoons. In addition to this, children will continue to participate in the many sporting competitions which are available throughout the summer term.

### PSHCE & CITIZENSHIP

We will continue to offer activities that help to prepare the children for their transition to Secondary School.

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION
