FS2



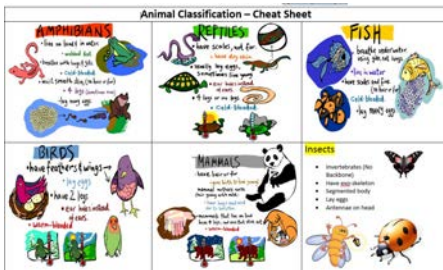
