The aims of art at Normanby Primary School are to engage, inspire and challenge pupils, to have fun and help children grow to see themselves as artists. Children are progressively taught key skills in art including; drawing, painting, mixed media and sculpture and evaluation. Teachers equip children with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of craft, art and design. As pupils progress through school, they will further develop their ability to think critically and develop a thorough understanding of art and design, including evaluating their own art. Our curriculum introduces children to influential artists and also incorporates how art and design reflect and shape our history and contribute to the culture, creativity and wealth of our nation.

National Curriculum

Key stage 1

Pupils should be taught:

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Key stage 2

Pupils should be taught:

- to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas
- to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]
- about great artists, architects and designers in history.
