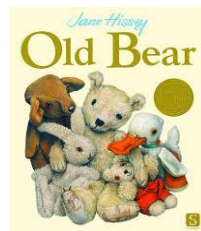
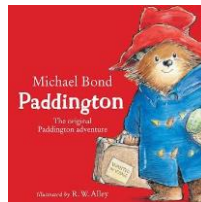
Books we are reading in KS1
