#### French

The aim of French at Normanby Primary School is to inspire in pupils a curiosity and fascination in language learning, as well as experiencing how other cultures live, that will remain with them for the rest of their lives. Lessons are planned to engage children, promote enjoyment and enthusiasm for learning and give children the opportunity to develop a resilience to challenge through a high quality curriculum that includes listening and responding, speaking, reading and responding and writing through songs, rhymes and stories as well as interactive activities which develop intonation and pronunciation in French. The children also develop intercultural understanding and experience French in real life contexts, where they can practices conversational skills. The curriculum for each year group is based on oracy, literacy, intercultural understanding and application of new skills in real life contexts. French language learning provides an appropriate balance of spoken and written language and should lay the foundations for further foreign language teaching at key stage 3. It should enable pupils to understand and communicate ideas, facts and feelings in speech and writing, focused on familiar and routine matters, using their knowledge of phonology, grammatical structures and vocabulary.
