Attendance

Our attendance policy can be found on our school website.

- All our children have already experienced some disruption to their learning; regular attendance has never been more important.
- The school may ask for evidence of medical appointments or illness. For example, a medical appointment letter may be requested.
- All absences are reported to the Local Authority; frequent absences or lateness may result in the Local Authority issuing a Warning Notice or a fine.
- Holidays cannot be authorised in term time except for some specific and limited circumstances. Request Forms are available from the school office.
- · Please inform school by letter, telephone call or email of any absences your child has.
- Please inform the school office of any absence, by phone before 9:30am.
- If you require any further information regarding attendance, please ask to speak to Mrs Metcalf or Miss Lawrence via the school office.



First Aid

If your child has a minor accident he/she will be given a note to bring home. If a more serious injury has been sustained you will be informed by telephone.

Medical

Please ensure that school is made aware of any medical conditions your child may have.

Asthma: Inhalers must be in date and school must have an asthma plan. Guidance says

that inhalers must also have a spacer.

Illness: Public Health England advise that a child must have 48 hours of wellness before returning to school following sickness and diarrhoea; therefore, school follow this advice.

Head lice: you will be informed by phone to collect your child

for treatment.

Medicines in school: School are permitted to administer prescribed medication providing parents have completed the relevant medicine form and have the agreement of Mr Faulkner/Mrs Pentney. The forms are available from the School Office.

Care plans: These are completed if your child has a severe medical condition.

Parent Pay (an online payment service)

We are pleased to announce that we accept payments online for items such as dinner money, school visits, uniform & Sunshine Club. Using a secure website called ParentPay you are able to pay online using your credit or debit card. ParentPay is our preferred method of making payments to school.

How does ParentPay help our school?

- · reduces the administrative time spent on banking procedures
- keeps accurate records of payments made to every service for every student payments do not bounce
- · reduces paper 'waste'
- · allows for easy and quick refunds to be made back to the payment card
- · improves communication between the school and parents concerning payments
- offers a more efficient payment collection process, reducing the amount of money held on school premises
- helps us improve school-home communication with its integrated email/SMS messaging centre

How do I get started?

We will send you an activation letter containing your activation username g password once your child has started school to enable you to setup your ParentPay account. During the activation process you will be guided through changing your username g password to something more memorable. If you have more than one child at a ParentPay school/s you can also add children to a single account providing one login for all children at ParentPay schools.


Early Years

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum has 7 areas of learning.

Assessments will be made by carrying out observations and by talking to your child. We also value your views, therefore we will be sending out termly questionnaires for you to complete.

Reading



- Your child will bring home a reading book on a Monday g on a Friday. If your child is not bringing a book home please inform a member of staff.
- A 'Home School book 'will be sent to soon after your child starts school. Record in this book each time you and your child read.
- For every 30 reads your child will receive a small prize.
- · If you would like your child to join our Book Club, please see a member of staff.

Letters & Sounds

Our school are transitioning to a scheme of work called 'little Wandle' for teaching phonics. (this is a revised format of Letters & Sounds)

We look at :-

Exploring sounds, such as environmental, instrument, body g voice sounds Rhythm, rhyme and alliteration Blending and segmenting words orally

Writing

We encourage your child to do lots of mark making in FS1. We Will be encouraging your child to hold writing implements between the thumb and 2 fingers and to recognise the first letter in their name.



PSHE

(Personal, Social and Health Education)



Relationships and health education (RHE) became compulsory in September 2020. However, at Normanby Primary School, we've already been delivering this for many years as part of our PSHE curriculum.

Teaching in this area of the curriculum includes work on health and hygiene and (age appropriate) drug education and relationships g sex education (RSE).

Again this year, there will be an emphasis on resilience and mental health and well-being.

Rules & Rewards



Our school has high expectations for pupil's behaviour. Our three main whole school rules that the children created are:

- · Be safe
- · Be respectful
- · Be Ready

Each year group has different day-to-day ways of rewarding the children for positive behaviours. Alongside this, we have 'Reach for the Stars' in each classroom across school, which is a reward system to praise and celebrate children who go 'beyond the expected' and work hard towards our STAR values. Once all children in the class have their star on the class chart, the whole class receive a reward of their choice!

We will continue to use Silver and Gold stars to celebrate exceptional behaviour at the end of each term.

We will also be celebrating work and positive behaviour on Marvellous Me so please check this regularly.

School Rewards

Reading Rewards: Home/School book prizes given when have 30 reads/comments/pieces of homework are recorded inside Home/School book.

Stars: Silver and gold stars are awarded to individual children termly.

Postcards: A surprise posted to your home! Given to selected children for a variety of reasons.

End of year awards: A small selection of awards for different areas of learning.

Stickers & certificates: Given as instant praise.
