Assessment

Reception Baseline:





In each of the 17 aspects there is a goal which children are expected to achieve by the end of FS2. Further information is available in the FS2 iBook.

Assessments will be made through assessing work, by carrying out observations and by talking to each child. We also value your views, therefore we will be sending out termly questionnaires for you to complete.

Reading





- Reading records will be issued to FS2 Y6 in the Autumn term.
- Reading records, phonics resources & family books are to remain in book bags and to be brought to school every day.
- Read 5x per week at home and comment, sign and date the reading record when your child has read.
- Phonic books will be sent home each Thursday and returned to school the following Thursday.
- Reading Raffle (for phonic books) children will be issued with a ticket after 20, 40, 60 reads (not books) etc. Each ticket will be entered into the year group raffle box. At the end of each term, names will be drawn from each year group raffle box and book prizes will be given.
- Share books will be sent home each Friday and returned to school following Friday. These are for adults to read to the child.

Phonics

Our school uses the scheme, 'Little Wandle, Letters and Sounds' for teaching phonics.

Exploring sounds, such as environmental, instrument, body & voice sound Rhythm, rhyme and alliteration.

Blend and segment words orally.

Letter/grapheme recognition
Read words by blending letters, e.g. a-t = at, d-o-g = dog
Spell words by segmenting the word, e.g. cat = c-a-t
Read simple captions
Read decodable words, e.g.cat, dog, pig
Read tricky words (words that cannot be blended), e.g. the, to, go
Learn the letter names

Writing

Your child will practise writing his/her name daily. We will encourage them to hold writing implements between the thumb and 2 fingers in a tripod grip.

Family book

This book is for you to use to record anything your family does at home. This could be through writing, drawing or sticking in photos, certificates, cinema tickets etc. We have also given some activities for you to complete together as a family. You can also record when you have shared stories by writing a little bit about what your child enjoyed or your child could draw a picture. We will look at your books each Friday and give out stickers for their sticker chart which is kept in school. Your child will receive a certificate at the end of each half term if activities are completed.

Books to take home - 2 different types of book

Share books: Your child will bring home two books for you to read to your child and talk about together (green sticker on the book spine). They have words that your child may not be able to read. Share books will be changed every Friday.

Phonic book: Your child will bring home one phonic book each week which they have read and practised at school with staff. This book is for your child to practise reading independently to you. It has been carefully chosen so that they can work out all the words.

Reading bags

Reading bags (blue school book bags only) need to be in school every day. At the end of the day your child will put any letters/forms inside their reading bag that staff have put inside their tray. Please check reading bags daily and return any completed reply slips/forms quickly.



PSHE

Personal, Social and Health Education

Relationships and health education (RHE) became compulsory in September 2020. However, at Normanby Primary School, we've already been delivering this for many years as part of our PSHE curriculum.



Teaching in this area of the curriculum includes work on health and hygiene and (age appropriate) drug education and relationships & sex education (RSE).

Again this year, there will be an emphasis on resilience and mental health and well-being.

Our Learning Journey and policies are available on the school website. We have also created some leaflets to outline the different strands of the curriculum, which will be sent home shortly.



Self-care skills

Please encourage your child to dress/undress and put coats on and fasten them independently. Please ensure all coats, hats, gloves, scarves and water bottles are named. If your child is unable to recognise their belongings staff cannot give items out at home time

if they are not named.

Overview of FS2/Whole School Rewards

Homework stickers: kept on sticker chart in school: prize given when have 20 stickers

Homework certificates: (Family book activities)

Reading Raffle: Termly prize raffle when after 20, 40, 60 reads of phonic books,

Other stickers: put on your child's clothes - to transfer to sticker chart in family book

Celebration assembly: Certificates are given to 3 children each week who have made us feel proud.

Stars: Silver and gold stars are awarded to individual children termly.

Postcards: A surprise posted to your home! Given to selected children for a variety of reasons.

End of year awards: A small selection of awards for different areas of learning.

Reach for the stars: Whole class receive a reward of their choice when all children achieve a star!

Super Duper Shop: Children earn super duper tokens for doing super duper things! They save the tokens which they can spend at the shop each Friday or they can save their tokens to buy a more expensive item at a later date.



Attendance
