IPADS



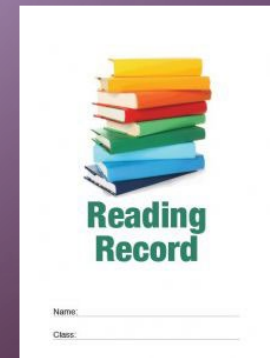
- Children need a fully charged iPad in school each day

- Spellings are issued on a Thursday and the children will sit the spelling quiz the following Thursday

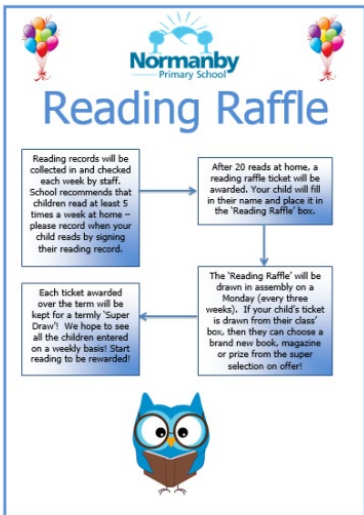
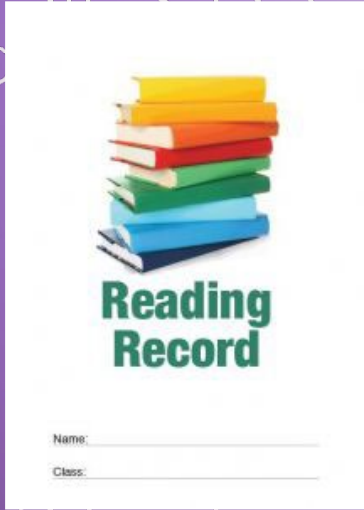
Weekly homework includes:

- reading a minimum of 5x every week,
- practising times tables and division facts,
- practising spellings.



Reading

- Reading records will be issued to F52 - Y6 in the autumn term.
- Reading records should be taken home each night and returned to school daily.
- Children should continue to read to an adult 5x per week at home. Please date and initial when your child has read.
- Keep a running total of how many times your child has read so your teachers can see.
- Reading Raffle – children will be issued with a ticket after 20, 40, 60 reads etc.
- Each ticket will be entered into the year group raffle box. At the end of each term, names will be drawn from each year group raffle box and book prizes will be given.
- Some year groups will also take home share books – these are for adults to read to the child.



Start and End of the School Day

- School gates will be opened from 8.30am. Children who have permission to walk to school independently (Years 5 and 6) should aim to be on the playground from 8.40am.
- School starts at 8.50am. After 9.00am please enter school via the main office.
- A member of staff will be at the Y5 door on a morning to welcome children/take messages.
- School gates will open again from 3pm please be aware that year groups may still be using the playgrounds and school site.
- Collection from the Y5 door at 3.20pm for those children who need to be collected.
- After 3.30pm your child will be placed in Sunshine Club and there will be a charge.
- Two members of staff are on the Y5 door at home time to ensure the safe handover of children.
- Please notify us if anyone different will be collecting your child from school.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS

- Please ensure that school is made aware of any medical conditions your child may have.
- Inhalers must be in date and in school.
- Inhalers must also have a spacer with a completed asthma plan.
- Public Health England advise that a child must have 48 hours of wellness before returning to school following sickness and diarrhoea; therefore, school follow this advice.
- School are permitted to administer antibiotics providing parents have completed the relevant medicine form and have the agreement of Mr Faulkner/Mrs Pentney. The forms are available from the School Office.

ENGLISH

Key objectives for reading and writing:

- Use a range of sentences starters (fronted adverbials)
- Greater range of punctuation
- Adapt writing to a range of genres
- Read a range of texts whole class reading twice a week
- Practise and develop skills using VIPERS
- Pupils will participate in daily spelling activities. Spellings will be sent home for the children to learn. This may relate to a particular spelling pattern/rule or may be topic related vocabulary. They will be tested the following week.
- Accelerated Reader
- Handwriting – (joined, legible and fluent)
- Authors being studied this year: Rick Riordan (Autumn) Steven Hawkins (Spring).

MATHS

- Times tables & division facts up to 12×12 and $12 \div$
- **Rapid recall** - Converting units of metric measure, equivalent fractions, percentages and decimals
- Formal Written methods for $+$ $-$ \times \div

New concepts - Multiplying by a two-digit number, place value up to 1,000,000, multiply proper fractions and drawing angles.

- Parental Support - Encourage to learn times table facts.
- Numeracy Workout
- Squeebles and TT Rock Stars and Key Stage 2 Maths APPs



PSHE

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND HEALTH EDUCATION



Relationships and health education (RHE) became compulsory last year. However, at Normanby Primary School, we've already been delivering this curriculum for many years.

Teaching in this area of the curriculum includes work on health and hygiene and (age appropriate) drug education and sex & relationships education (SRE).

Again this year, there will be an extra emphasis on resilience and mental health and well-being.

HOW CHILDREN ARE ASSESSED AT NORMANBY PRIMARY SCHOOL

A tracking system is used in school which reflects the standards required of the New National Curriculum and is used to measure where a child is working in relation to the Programme of study for their Year group.

- This 'snapshot' of information is gathered half-termly and shared with Parents formally at Consultation Evenings in Autumn, Spring and Summer and in the End of year report.
- However, discussions about your child's progress within a Programme of study, or any other questions you may have about your child's progress, are of course welcome at any time during the year.

END OF KS2 - ASSESSMENT

- In the summer term, children in Year 2 and Year 6 will be formally assessed using SATs.
- These tests in English and Maths will reflect the new National Curriculum.
- At the end of Year 6, children will sit tests in:
 - Reading
 - Maths
 - Spelling, punctuation and grammar

These tests will be both set and marked externally, and the results will be used to measure the school's performance (for example, through reporting to Ofsted and published league tables). Your child's marks will be used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broader picture of their attainment for transition to KS3.
