Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

At Normanby, all pupils benefit from an extensive music curriculum rooted in the Charanga Music Curriculum from Tees Valley Music Service, our local music hub. After Music Leader training with our Local Music Hub our curriculum offer is rooted in the use of Charanga's Original Scheme with opportunities for performances to our parents/carers.

The curriculum broadly offers opportunities for all year groups from FS1 to Year 6 to engage in composing, listening, performing and appraising music.

Throughout the academic year, each child receives approximately an hour of music per week, with increased time allocations during specific projects. For instance, Year 4 students participate in an Easter Show allowing them to explore music-making, singing and performing.

Weekly lessons are structured into a 40-minute music session, followed by a singing assembly. During these assemblies, pupils learn songs tailored for the diverse performance opportunities that the school frequently offers in collaboration with local organisations and the academy trust.

Our inclusive music curriculum ensures that children with SEND and other disabilities can access differentiated teaching opportunities, allowing all children to develop musical skills while enjoying the process.

We fervently believe that every pupil should have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument. Consequently, all Year 3 pupils learn to read music and play the recorder, with opportunities to perform for parents and carers throughout the year we target this year group with a music specialist who aids in the delivery of the recorder provision.

In addition to this our collaboration with a local music specialist enhances the delivery of the curriculum and the performance opportunities we provide, which includes links to religious education and partnerships with the local church.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

In addition to the opportunities provided in classroom music lessons, we offer all pupils in Year 3 to 6 the chance to join our school choir, "Sing Squad." This choir performs regularly at numerous events detailed in "Part C" of our musical development plan.

Pupils also have the opportunity to take peripatetic music lessons in guitar, keyboard, and drums through our partnership with Music Works. We have maintained a longstanding relationship with this company for over 10 years, facilitating music lessons for our pupils during the school day, funded by parents and carers.

We have established a partnership with "Rock Steady," a band-based peripatetic music service delivered by professionals. Their inclusive program promotes well-being and supports academic progress. We have secured bursary places for our pupils, offer pupil premium funded spots through the school, and provide additional funded options for parents and carers.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.
